School News

There is a waste battery collection point in the reception area of Bemerton St John Primary School. Batteries are made from important resources, including lead, cadmium, zinc, and mercury. Each recycled battery can be taken apart and the materials recovered and used to make new batteries or other items. If you put your used batteries in your bin at home they will be taken to landfill and the resources lost. Batteries suitable for

recycling include: 6V, D, C, AA, AAA, 9V and button batteries.

This is welcome news, a handy local place to take old batteries which can leak toxic metals in landfill.

The school is also **collecting used stamps** to raise money for Swallows class's chosen charity, Canine Partners. The charity assists people with disabilities to enjoy greater independence and a better quality of life through the help of specially trained dogs.

Wilton Community Land Trust and Erskine Barracks:

public meeting 27 April

John Glen MP told the well attended meeting that Wilton CLT had achieved "something spectacular" in being part of the winning bid. Alan Caldwell, community planning consultant, and the CLT board led discussion to help those present identify principles they felt to be important in the development of the Erskine site. Redrow, the builders who now own the site, have said they want the development

to be an 'exemplar', and want to involve the public starting from a 'blank sheet of paper' for ideas.

Among the main principles identified were the importance of the involvement of Wilton CLT at every stage and the integration of the new development with the existing town of Wilton, with particular regard to infrastructure, especially transport links and community services. This was only the first in a series of meetings which will enable the public to have their say.
