Wylye Valley Meats. It is with much regret that Lily Newman makes this announcement: We have had to shut the shop in Wilton. There is too much competition and Tom wanted to sell only good quality local meat and not lower his standards. We want to thank everyone who supported him.

Village Hall kitchen roof: this roof could not be included in the October 2017 survey because of the heavy growth of ivy. The ivy has now been removed and revealed that a new roof is needed urgently. Quotations have been obtained and grants applied for. Over half the necessary funding has been secured and if the final application is successful (which will be known in October) work will begin as soon as possible. The parish council agreed a grant of £500 equivalent to £3.20 from the precept of a band D house.

The Area Board commented that the hall had lower reserves than it would expect to see and it would be good to see some fund raising for the hall within the village to increase them.

Remembrance 2019

The promised booklet with the text of the servicemen's speeches from the service last year and some notes about the village at the time should be delivered to every house in early November.

If you displayed a wreath commemorating one of the eleven Quidhampton servicemen who were killed in the First World War and you want to display it again this year please contact the editor before the beginning of November and it will be delivered to you.

Other notes from the September Parish Council meeting

This is not an official or complete report. Minutes will be available after the next meeting.

Councillor Richard Mullett has resigned. There are now two vacancies that can be filled by co-option.

Playground maintenance: please tell the clerk (details on back page) of any issues you notice in the playground. Thanks were expressed to Richard who had taken this role while he was on the council.

Re-wilding: Emma Lovell, a villager from Coronation Square, spoke about creating an area of wild flowers and other plants in the playground and more tree planting. The clerk will investigate insurance and safety aspects.

Emma will write an article about re-wilding for the November newsletter. The aim is to encourage insect and bird life and it really does work, even in a small patch in a garden.

Traffic issues on Lower Road The report from the working group was discussed. The group had looked at all the questionnaires returned by the village and had drawn up a list of recommendations. They had not included any road closures or banning right hand turns into Lower Road from the Netherhampton Road as these were opposed by a significant number of villagers.

The 15 recommendations include build outs to form a chicane, speed humps and speed tables (a raised platform as seen in New Street Salisbury outside the Cosy Club), better markings of the footway and where the 20 mph limit begins, moving the bollards

from the middle to the edge of the footway and reducing the speed limit in Skew Road. The full list is part of the published agenda – see village noticeboard and website. Contact the editor if you have problems finding it. It explains exactly where all the recommendations will go.

Action: the list will be officially costed and the parish council will then decide realistic priorities and put it forward to the Community Area Transport group.

The traffic working group consists of councillors Paul Cripps, Sandie Smith and Ken Taylor and was appointed at the extraordinary meeting on 13 August. Parish clerk Clare Churchill was in attendance.

First Aid A qualified first aid trainer now living in the village has generously offered to run courses for villagers. The parish council agreed to pay the cost of hall hire and first aid kits to take home so the courses would be free for villagers.

Use the enclosed yellow flyer to apply for the course on Saturday 19 October.

Defibrillator: the funding application was successful and a defibrillator should be in the village soon.

Speed Indicator Device: our ill-fated SID has never worked properly in Quidhampton and is again being taken to the manufacturers by the chair of the parish council. There was discussion (but no decision) about going it alone and getting a simpler model for use only in Quidhampton.

PARKING: the parish council asks all villagers who park in the road to leave space for a parent and buggy to walk by on the footway. It is so dangerous for them to have to go round vehicles and out into the road.
