### When can we eat and drink inside?

**From Tuesday evening 18 May.** The White Horse will then open every day except Monday. It will also be closed on Tuesday lunchtimes.

### What are the rules?

The same as now. Table service only, up to six people or two households together, wear masks except when seated, keep socially distanced. So no standing at the bar and no hugging – yet!

Use hand sanitiser, sign in with track and trace or give details, follow the one way system.. all the things we have got used to.


### What is happening before 18 May?

The White Horse is open from Wednesday to Sunday. Seating is outside, in the marquee or on the patio. The staff have worked hard to make it inviting. The marquee is very welcoming with lots of plants, and two classy new heaters with a third on order. The patio area is more enclosed and heated too.

Hot water bottles (sanitized after every use) are popular but remember to **take your own blanket.**

Covid regulations mean blankets cannot be provided.

## **The White Horse: menu**

*The full menu is displayed outside the pub*

**Starters** prices from £3.95 (homemade soup) - £5.95

**Examples:** salt and pepper squid with garlic mayo and salad garnish  
Garlic mushrooms in creamy garlic sauce with fresh bread  
Pate and toast with salad garnish

**Light bites ideal for lunch.** £5.25 - £6.95

Jacket potatoes with choice of six fillings  
Baguettes or sandwiches with salad or fries choice of seven fillings  
Ploughman's lunch: trio of cheese £10.50 or ham and cheese or sausage both £10.95

**Mains** £9.95 - £13.95

**Examples:** chilli con carne with rice and garlic bread  
Honey and mustard ham, 2 eggs, fries and salad  
Pie of the day, potatoes and vegetables  
Lasagne, salad and garlic bread  
Cajun spiced chicken, fries and salad

**Steaks:** 8 oz sirloin £18.95; 10 oz gammon £13.95 both served with all the trimmings

Andrew's beef burger, fries and salad £11.95

**Fish:** Cod or scampi and chips £12.95; salmon fillet in range and dill butter, salad and new potatoes £13.95

**Vegetarian mains** £10.95 - £11.95

**Examples:** mushroom risotto with parmesan and garlic bread  
Vegetarian lasagne, salad and garlic bread  
Veggie sausages, fries, eggs, beans or peas  
Three cheese macaroni, garlic bread and salad
